Our place in The Diocese of Virginia



- The Rt. Rev'd E. Mark Stevenson is the 14th Bishop of the Diocese of Virginia.
- Good Shepherd is one of about 30 Mission Churches in the Diocese.
- Committee on Congregational Missions (CCM) lead by the Rev Webster Gibson
 - Determines the allocation of financial Mission Support
 - Provides oversite in reporting and operations
- Diocesan financial support critical to our operations
 - CCM aid: 2021 \$13,900, 2022 \$13,900, 2023 \$14,400
 - 2021 Scott Foundation grant for \$3,500 for Church painting and repairs
 - 2022 CCM emergency grant of \$6,000 for repair of septic system
 - 2022 Peter Lee Small Church Grant for \$5,000 for Prayer & Meditation Garden
 - 2023 Grant request will be written for \$2,000 for new carpet for Parish Hall

Our Supply Clergy



- Rev. Deborah Rutter
 - Retired from Calvery, Front Royal in 2017
 - Deb was our supply priest for our first outside service in fall of 2020 as we were coming out of the COVID shutdown
 - Rev Deb has served as a supply priest and provided spiritual guidence through 2022
 - She will continue as a supply priest with GS through 2023
- Rev. Martha Clark
 - Retired from St. Augustine, Washington DC in 2019
 - Martha and Bryan moved to Lincoln, VA in 2021
 - Martha was licensed to serve as a supply priest in the Diocese of VA in February 2022
 - With the Bishop's blessing she has served GS as a supply priest and provided spiritual guidence

Rob retired from Trinity, Upperville in 2018, after serving for 11 years as their rector. He is a graduate of Georgetown University and the Virginia Theological Seminary. Spiritual Growth in 2022

- During Epiphany Rev. Deborah Rutter lead a wonderful zoom
 discussion on "The Book of Joy: Lasting Happiness in a Changing World", conversations with
 His Holiness the Dali Lama and Archbishop Desmond Tutu. About 16 people attended,
 including 6 from outside our congregation.
- During March, Cindy Ingram lead a 4 week zoom discussion on "Living the Beatitudes". Each weekly meeting ended in Evening Prayer led by Rev. Martha Clark.
- Rev. Martha Clark led monthly "Fall Meditation Walks" at Cool Springs from Sept. through Dec. There were 18 individuals that participated. Many of these were people from outside our congregation.
- This winter 10 women met in the parish hall on Sunday evenings for a light supper and a "Centered" discussion led by Rev. Martha Clark. Together we explored what it means to center our lives on Jesus Christ in a way that leads us to form loving relationships. Listening to each other during these sessions blended us together as fellow disciples.

Spiritual Growth 2023

- Tim Hall has started a men's Centered group. This band of four welcomes any who would like to join every other week in the parish hall for a light supper and centered discussions. The day and time float. They seem to be enjoying themselves.
- In January Martha has started a "Praying Through Winter" series that meets in the parish hall every 3rd Saturday. This series focuses on different methods of praying, including the use of our bodies.
- New member reception, confirmation, and baptism preparation classes will be offered this winter/spring in preparation for a visit by our new Assistant Bishop Gayle Harris on April 23rd.
- A variation of our meditation walks will begin in the spring or summer.

Prayer and Meditation Garden - Fall 2022 Making a garden space



- Clearing
 - Remove dead trees
 - Clearing branches, limbs, underbrush, large stones
 - Levelling garden areas
 - Building pathways with timber and stone
 - Weeding and preparing soil in garden areas
- Built a retaining wall for pollinator garden
- Plantings

Witch Hazel (Winter bloom), Great Laurel (One of Virginia's native Rhododendrons) Serviceberry (Early spring bloom), Blueberry bushes (For the birds, and us!) Herbaceous plugs: Allegheny pachysandra and Wood anemone



Prayer and Meditation Garden – Spring 2023 Volunteer Gardeners



- Trees and schrubs
 - Black Huckleberry, Rosier Dogwood, Mountain Laurel,
 Butterfly weed, American (15/16) Chestnut
- Herbaceous plugs
 - Solomon's Seal, Indian cucumber, Partridge berries,
 Spotted and American wintergreen
- Installation of bird bath or Fire Pit to be a center for a gathering place
- Install benches or sitting logs for gatherings
- Pollinator garden
 - Prepare ground for planting
 - Scouting and collecting candidate plantings from friends and neighbors



THE REAL OF THE PARTY OF THE PA

- Funding raising for Outreach and Mission organizations
 - Donated \$500 for Episcopal Relief and Development (ERD) for Ukraine relief
 - Good Friday offering of \$1,000 in support of the Diocese of Jerusalem and Middle East. \$470 of this was raised from the congregation.
 - Remembering St. Francis of Assisi, during October we collected pet food and supplies for the Clarke County Animal Shelter
 - Collected 768 lbs. of food plus paper products, cleaning supplies, toiletries, clothing, and monetary donations for the FISH food bank in Berryville.



- Reaching out to people in our community
 - Just Because it's July Celebration -
 - free chicken, hot dogs, sides, ice cream, and live music
 - About 40 people from the Pine Grove community attended
 - 3rd Annual Christmas Boxes
 - 130 boxes filled with homemade cookies and other goodies
 - Shared with our Meditation walkers, Centered, and the Pine Grove AA
 - Delivered to the Village of Pine Grove and some in Shenandoah Retreat and Raven Rocks Rd.
 - Christmas Caroling at Commonwealth Senior Living Center



- Funding raising for Outreach and Mission organizations
 - Good Shepherd will be sending \$1,150 to Absalom Jones Fund. \$650 in donations from the congregation and \$500 from our outreach budget.
 - Good Friday offering in support of the Diocese of Jerusalem and Middle East.
 - Remembering St. Francis of Assisi, during October we will collect pet food and supplies for the Clarke County Animal Shelter
 - Collections of food plus paper products, cleaning supplies, toiletries, clothing and monetary donations for the FISH food bank in Berryville.



- New partnership with FISH to bring food relief and social services support to Pine Grove and Shenandoah Retreat
 - Fish has started a new project called Community Table. This entails bringing a food truck to various locations in Clarke County.
 - Food is handed out.
 - New clients are registered.
 - Social Services is available to discuss other needs.
 - Good Shepherd will be one of these locations.
 - The first Community Table at Good Shepherd was Feb. 4th.
 - Starting in April, Good Shepherd will host this event on a monthly basis.

Facility

- Overview: Budget overrun... But we accomplished a lot!
- Maintenance
 - Cleaning, insect control, lawn care, snow removal, HVAC
 - Tree work, miscellaneous repairs & painting
 - Major septic system repairs
 - Basement: Two new doors, upgraded kitchen sink drains
 - Replaced all lightbulbs with LEDs
 - This continues to be (rightfully so) a major part of our operating budget

Improvements

- Installed additional hardwired internet connection in back of sanctuary
- Initial work on Prayer & Meditation Garden (clearing, layout, fall planting)
- Replaced church sign & refinished sign posts
- New tables: two rectangular and one large round
- Added 21A gravel to back parking area
- Repaved main driveway & parking area

- Continue working toward "NetZero by 2030"
- Replace parish hall flooring
- Replace sacristy windows or add storm windows
- Find homes for the old pump organ and upright piano (in Parish Hall)
- And all the other routine maintenance as noted earlier
